After your tenant vacates the premises there might be personal property of your tenant. If this is the case, you should use the attached form entitled "Notice of Right to Reclaim Abandoned Property". This notice should be addressed to the tenant and mailed to his last known address. If you do not know that address, then you should mail it to the premises that were just vacated.

All property should be itemized in the space provided or on an attached sheet of paper. You must also indicate where the items should be retrieved. The items do not have to remain on the premises but can immediately be moved off and stored in any locked storage facility.

The tenant has eighteen (18) days to reclaim the property and therefore you should put in a date eighteen (18) days from the date that this is mailed out in the space provided. If the property is worth less than \$700, please check the first box and this will allow you to dispose of the items in any way that you see fit. Of course you must wait the eighteen (18) day period. If the property is worth more than \$700, then you must check the second box and an auction must be held.

I would recommend that you contact the LOS ANGELES DAILY JOURNAL and they will take care of publishing the applicable notices that are required in order to have an auction. Please note that the attached form is unnecessary if the Sheriff actually did the lockout. In that instance the tenant will only have 15-days to retrieve their items. You will still need to hold an auction if the value of the property is \$700 or more.

## Notice of Right to Reclaim Abandoned Property

After the property is sold and the cost of storage, advertising, and sale is deducted, the remaining money will be paid over to the county. You may claim the remaining money at any time within one year after the county receives the money."

\_\_\_\_\_(2) "Because this property is believed to be worth less than \$700, it may be kept, sold, or destroyed without further notice if you fail to reclaim it within the time indicated above."
